## Phil's new writing role

A WRITER from Pembrokeshire who worked as an actor in the first production by the Torch Theatre 40 years ago will be back in his home town this month to sign copies of his debut novel. Phil Rowlands was born and educated in Haverfordwest. He studied at the Royal Welsh College of Music and Drama in Cardiff and in 1977 was one of the founding members of the Torch Theatre Company in Milford Haven. But Phil also had a passion for telling stories as well as acting them out.

"I love telling stories. For a long time I worked as an actor in film, TV, radio and theatre. It tested, exhilarated, excited and terrified me all at the

ame time," he said.

When he decided to move into production and writing his experience as an actor was invaluable. "I wrote scripts and screenplays and found I could do it and, to my surprise, sell them," he said.

"Having been an actor, though, helped hone dialogue and structure." When he arrives at Victoria Bookshop, Haverfordwest, on Friday, December 15, from 10am to noon, he will have a new role as he promotes


his psychological thriller Siena.

"I had thought many times of writing a novel but was too frightened to start the lonely and long journey. Siena began as an idea for a film but it felt more suited to be a story in novel form. I have always been interested in the psychology of emotions and its fragile balance of opposites and by the resilience and diversity of the human spirit to face and overcome the seemingly impossible.

"In Siena, I wanted to explore grief and loss, as well as love and the need for retribution. Sara, the main character has to face the worst thing that could ever happen, happening; the unthinkable becoming a reality. It is her journey from

desolation to hope that is the theme of the book. How she gets there, who helps or hinders along the way is the heart of the story."

Siena is published by Williams and Whiting at £8.99.


